ORDINANCE NO. 1960-23
(Chapter 615 Vehicles and Traffic - Amendment)

The City of Reedsburg, Sauk County, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I: PURPOSE

The purpose of this ordinance is to amend Chapter 615 Vehicles and Traffic, specifically 615-2 – Speed Limits; 615-4 – Preferential Streets; 615-5 Stop Signs; 615-7 – One-way Traffic; 615-9 – Parking limits; 615-11 – All Night Parking Prohibited; 615-26 – Handicapped Parking (all amendments are attached).

SECTION II: PROVISION AMENDED

City of Reedsburg Code Chapter 615 is revised by this Ordinance.

SECTION III: PROVISION AS AMENDED

City of Reedsburg Code Chapter 615 is amended as attached, specifically sections:

615-2 – Speed Limits; 615-4 – Preferential Streets; 615-5 Stop Signs; 615-7 – One-way Traffic; 615-9 – Parking limits; 615-11 – All Night Parking Prohibited; 615-26 – Handicapped Parking (all amendments are attached).

SECTION IV: VALIDITY.

Should any section, clause or provision of the ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION V: CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED.

All ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION VI: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall be in force from and after its introduction and publication as provided by statute.

SECTION VII: PART OF CODE:

This Ordinance becomes part of the City of Reedsburg Code, Chapter 615.
