Whereas Donald H. Lichte has represented the City of Reedsburg in a number of leadership roles,

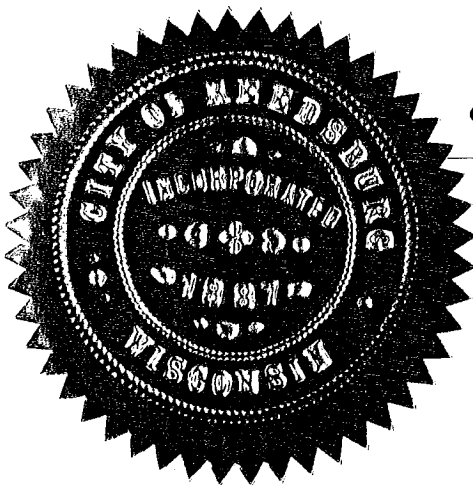

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Reedsburg has renamed the Business Park of Reedsburg to the Donald H. Lichte Business Park of Reedsburg.

§ 282-1 Firearms and ammunition; discharge, possession and sale.

- A. Discharging and carrying of firearms. No person except a sheriff, police officer or other law officer shall fire or discharge any firearm, rifle, spring gun, air gun, or pneumatic pellet gun of any description within the City of Reedsburg. **[Amended 6-22-2009]**
- B. Possession of ammunition and sale to minors. No minor person under the age of 18 years shall have in his possession any ammunition for any spring gun, air gun, or pneumatic pellet gun unless accompanied by parent, guardian or any person 18 years or more.
- C. No person shall intentionally sell or give away any firearm, rifle, spring gun, air gun, or pneumatic pellet gun, or ammunition therefor, to any person under the age of 18 years unless accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
- D. No person under the age of 18 years of age shall have in his possession any firearm, rifle or ammunition therefor, unless accompanied by parent or legal guardian.
- E. Supervised ranges and hunting within City. This section shall not prevent the maintenance and use of duly supervised rifle or pistol ranges authorized by the Common Council, but shall be deemed to prohibit hunting within the City, except where owners or occupants of private premises shall have been issued written permits to hunt or shoot on such premises by the Chief of Police after he shall have determined that such privileges are necessary for the protection of life or property and subject to such safeguards as he may impose for the safety of the lives and property of other persons within the City.

**§ 282-2 Throwing or shooting of arrows, stones, and other missiles prohibited.
[Amended 10-18-2012]**

No person shall throw or shoot any object, arrow, stone, or other missile or projectile, by hand or by any other means, at any other person or at, in, or onto any building, street, sidewalk, alley, highway, park, playground, or other place within the City of Reedsburg, with the exceptions as follows:

- A. In archery class conducted on school district property under the supervision of a qualified instructor; or
- B. At any bona fide business location where the sale of archery equipment takes place on a professionally developed indoor archery range; or
- C. At a designated outdoor archery range approved by the Common Council; or
- D. Hunting at least 300 feet from any building, or having building owner's permission, and having permission from the landowner; or
- E. Bow fishing for rough fish per § 29.405, Wis. Stats.

§ 282-3 Restrictions on the use of facsimile firearms

No person may carry or display a facsimile firearm in a manner that could reasonably be expected to alarm, intimidate, threaten or terrify another person.

In this section, "facsimile firearm" means any replica, toy, starter pistol or other object that bears a reasonable resemblance to or that reasonably can be perceived to be an actual firearm. "Facsimile firearm" does not include any actual firearm.

ORDINANCE NO. 1904-20
(Amending Chapter 282 Firearms & Weapons)

The Common Council of the City of Reedsburg, Sauk County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: PURPOSE.

The purpose of this ordinance is to amend Chapter 282 by adding 282-3 Restrictions on facsimile firearms.

SECTION II: PROVISION AMENDED.

City of Reedsburg Code Chapter 282 is hereby amended by this ordinance:

§ 282-3 Restrictions on the use of facsimile firearms

No person may carry or display a facsimile firearm in a manner that could reasonably be expected to alarm, intimidate, threaten or terrify another person.

In this section, "facsimile firearm" means any replica, toy, starter pistol or other object that bears a reasonable resemblance to or that reasonably can be perceived to be an actual firearm. "Facsimile firearm" does not include any actual firearm.

SECTION III: VALIDITY.

Should any section, clause or provision of the ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION IV: CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED.

All ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION V: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall be in force from and after its introduction and publication as provided by statute.

SECTION VI: PART OF CODE:

This Ordinance becomes part of the City of Reedsburg Code, Chapter 282.
