Approval of Minutes

Motion by Martin, seconded by Manion to approve the October 14, 2024, minutes as amended.

Motion approved

Review Devor bench project with historic sign.

Martin spoke to Johnny Kuhls about the sign who quoted her prices for both cast aluminum and bronze signs. Bids were also received from Supreme Awards. Additional bids will be requested for a 24" X 24" sign, with and without the HPC logo.

Review Progress on John Heaton recognition sign.

Discussion was held on ensuring accurate wording, especially towards the first electric plant. Discussion was held on the type of sign such as those for Nishan, Webb and Anna Stone.

SUPREME AWARDS

1. 12" X 12" black alum - \$57.60 plus engraving of \$.20/letter and \$7.00 logo charge. I have a black matte aluminum that engraves a whitish silver.
2. \$148.50 – this includes the text and logo. Have an option for a white aluminum or a silver aluminum. Sublimated aluminum that is meant for outdoors – this option allows you to have colored imprint
3. Cast Bronze – 12" X 12" - \$946.00 - Etched zinc – .062 thick, .125 thick – color would be silver with raised letters.
4. Cast Aluminum – 12" X 12" - \$578.00 – Cast Bronze or cast aluminum plaques - .25" thick with raised letters.

(Options 3 & 4) Shipping would be additional. There may be an additional charge for the logo.

12" X 12", .062 thick, silver zinc - \$465.00 plus shipping.

I also thought of another option. I have cast aluminum frames that come in black and silver color. We engrave an exterior black plastic plate that goes inside the frame. These come in sizes of 4" X 6", 6" X 8" and 8" X 10". I have black plastic that engraves white or silver. These frames have holes in the 4 corners. You could also use the black exterior alum for the plate. Pricing for these are as follows:

4" X 6" - \$55.50 plus engraving

6" X 8" - \$84.50 plus engraving

8" X 10" - \$142.00 plus engraving

Engraving is \$0.20/letter, \$7.00 for custom logo

A 12" X 24" cast aluminum plaque would be \$945.00 plus \$60.00 shipping. This represents a 10% discount. This price includes your logo in flat relief. They must have black and white vector art. Therefore, the gray scale areas in your logo would need to be changed. I would also do the logo in the reverse. What is black in the artwork will be raised and what is white would be recessed. I would think you would want the lettering of "Historic Preservation", "HP" and "Reedsburg" to be raised. The procedure for cast plaques is as follows: After you have made the decision to place the order and provide me with the text and where you would want the logo positioned I do a proof for you. You are provided 1 proof for free. If you change, add, or delete text then there is a \$10.00 proof charge for each additional proof. Therefore, make sure you are finalized on what text you want on the plaque. You would also receive a proof from the company once the order is actually placed.

You would need to decide what color background you want on the plaque and the mounting method. Most people go with a black background. The text and border would be raised silver. I have attached the mounting methods available.

We have the privilege to inform you, your home has been identified as having historic significance in the City of Reedsburg.

During the past year, through a grant-in-aid administered by the Wisconsin Historical Society, the City of Reedsburg contracted with a consulting firm to conduct an intensive survey of architecturally and historically significant resources within the city limits.

The survey recognized your home as one of the eight residents on South Park Street to be identified in a new historic district in the city. The South Park Street Historic District was identified for its concentration of large dwellings constructed between 1888 and 1910 with a high level of domestic style from its period of significance. The houses are represented of the Queen Anne style and related types and are the only kind of resource in the proposed district.

In addition to the architectural acknowledgement, homes in this in district were original homes of important community leaders of Reedsburg from that time period.

What does this mean to you? If you would agree to participation in this historic district designation you would be eligible for number of tax incentives. These tax credits could include such things as exterior painting, window and door repairs, and exterior brick and stone repair. There are several other incentives that you may be able access.

We would like to invite you, and fellow designees, to a special meeting at City Hall to discuss your interest in participating in this recognition. A representative of the Wisconsin Historic Preservation Office will be on hand to provide detailed information.

A Nationwide Call to Action Two Lights for Tomorrow April 18 – 19, 2025

What Is Two Lights for Tomorrow

Two Lights for Tomorrow is a nationwide initiative to commence the celebration of the 250th birthday of the United States of America. The famous ride of Paul Revere occurred on the overnight of April 18 – 19, 1775. Two Lights for Tomorrow commemorates that famous ride and uses the imagery of that shining light today as a uniting call to action for our citizens to celebrate and serve.

How to Participate, Part I

On April 18, 2025, we're calling for two lights to be displayed in every statehouse in the nation. They will be a reminder that the visual of a light shining out in the darkness on Revere's ride is not just something that mattered then; it's something that matters today, and for our collective tomorrow.

Some commissions are planning a public program as two lights are lit at the statehouse. This is an opportunity to not only raise public awareness of the upcoming 250th and how that visibly will be marked, but also to communicate the meaning of Revere's ride as history and remind our citizens of their part in the perpetual building of a "more perfect union."

How to Participate, Part II

The day following, states can promote a day of service on April 19th. At the community level, citizens will be called to serve their communities with volunteer projects ranging from park and cemetery clean-ups (especially with the close proximity to Earth Day) to community builds, food drives, and card writing to residents of care facilities, etc. The possibilities for service can be tailored to the needs of our citizens and in partnership with service organizations.

Projects Are Scalable for Communities and Individuals

From two spotlights at a state capitol building beaming in the darkness to smaller displays at municipal buildings, and lights in individual homes, every citizen can participate.

For state-level displays, there isn't a specific kind of light, duration of display, or location because we want it to be approachable and achievable for everyone given that each state-level commission will need to coordinate the approval processes within their own systems.

Some governor's offices are considering issuing executive orders to encourage government department buildings, municipalities, and every citizen to participate.

We encourage participation at as many locations as possible – community centers, municipal and county administrative buildings, and private residences.
